This book provides detail on army organisation, but there is some overlap with information contained in the 'Jane's Sentinel' series of publications. An executive summary discusses major developments in armies of the world - this issue mentions Brazil, Israel, Kenya, Mexico, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, UK and USA.

Each entry provides summary statistics, assessment, deployments tasks and operations, command and control, organisation, order of battle, operational art and tactical doctrine, training, procurement, inventory of vessels, aircraft and missiles in service. This title is a country by country analysis of the world's navies in terms of manpower, capabilities and major platforms.
