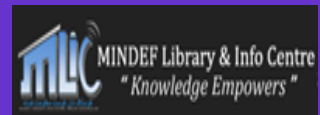

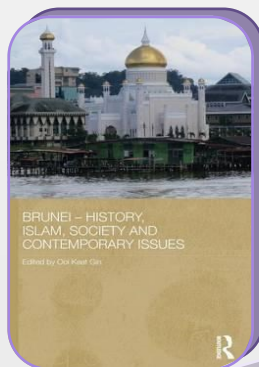


BRUNEI AND FOREIGN RELATIONS: A THEORETICAL FRAMEWORK

There has been a conventional understanding on the problems or predicaments of small states arising from their size: vulnerability to external pressure, the tendency to become sidelined in international politics and the danger of being used as pawns by powerful states in their international strategy. As a result, they demonstrate a high tendency to:

- ➔ Rely on international law to ensure security, independence and sovereignty
- ➔ Join regional and international organizations for recognition, legitimacy and equal status.
- ➔ Establish close relations with extra-regional great powers in order to enhance external balancing in regional politics.

A major challenge that Brunei has faced has been shared by all small states: maintaining their independence and sovereignty in the state of so-called 'international anarchy'. To understand contemporary Brunei's foreign relations, it is necessary to know how Brunei has responded to challenges in historical times and in the regional context.



In one of the sections in this book, it examines several important aspects of Brunei's foreign relations: Brunei's historical ties with Britain and early relations with its neighbours, its current commitment to ASEAN, its relations with extra-regional great powers Islamic diplomacy as part of identity diplomacy, and external disputes, their management and the role of peacemaker.

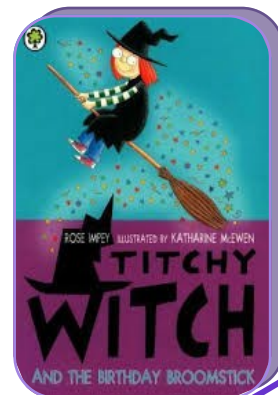

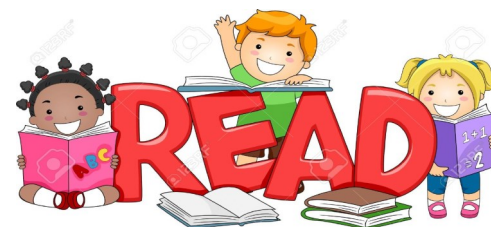
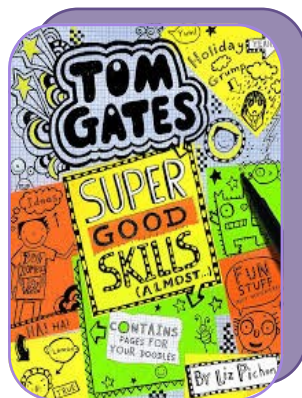

Current Issues and UPDATES



Cambodia

The arrest of Kem Sokha, the leader of Cambodia's main opposition party, the Cambodia National Rescue Party (CNRP), without warrant and in violation of his parliamentary immunity, is yet another step that illustrates the Cambodian government's rising intolerance of dissent ahead of upcoming polls next year.

Kem Sokha's arrest on account of treason, which made headlines the world over, has been disputed by the CNRP and is part of an ongoing pattern of politically motivated acts taken by the Cambodian state against the country's opposition. Given the significance of the event, it is worth examining this development in greater detail as well as considering the consequences it might have for Cambodian politics going forward.



Pakistan

PAKISTAN is one of the most populated countries in the world. Last week, the Pakistan Bureau of Statistics released a provisional report of the country's sixth population census. According to the report, Pakistan's population now stands at well over 200 million, which is almost 60 percent more than what it was during the last census that took place in 1998.

North Korea

Sixth nuclear test on Sunday released 140 kilotons of TNT equivalent, according to a new U.S. intelligence assessment. The margin of error on the early U.S. assessment is not known and the specific explosive yield figure may be revised, but the U.S. intelligence community assesses this device to have been several times more powerful than North Korea's previously most powerful nuclear test in September 2016

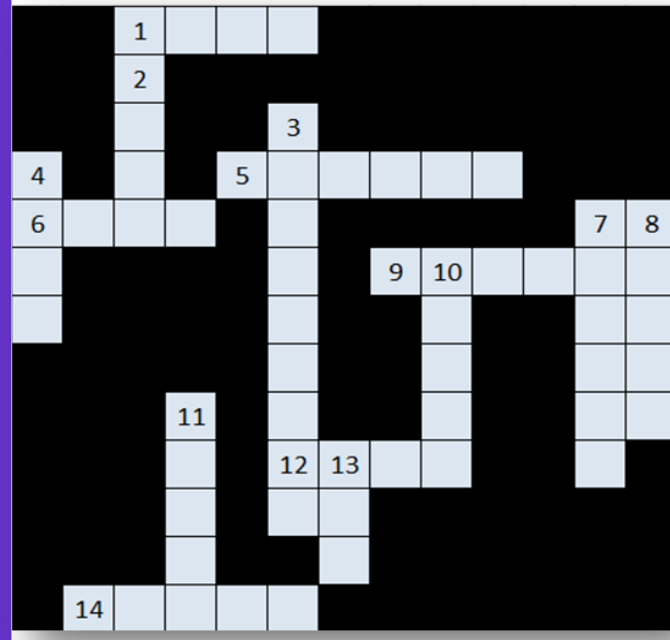

Follow these tips from Capt Neil Whitewick (RLC) and WO1 Mike Johns (SASC), part of the team behind the Force Troops Command Operational shooting competition.

COACH YOURSELF

The bullet may land somewhere different to where you want it to, but a good shot will always observe and analyse what's gone wrong

FITNESS FIRST

Modern day shooting is all about operational training. You have couple the theory with putting yourself outside your comfort zone. The concentration and running with all your kit on is hard work, so by the time you operate the trigger your body isn't in the condition it would be just lying in the prone position. That's why fitness matters



RELAX

Don't fear the ranges. Attack them with confidence, enjoy yourself and try to avoid self-induced pressure.

GO BACK TO BASICS

Make sure you understand the theory of shooting-marksanship principles in particular. Position and hold will become part of your muscle memory eventually but it's vital to understand sighting, breathing and trigger operation as well.

GET OUT

A number of things- from wind to humidity- affect the flight of the bullet and in time shooting in different conditions will become second nature. A well trained soldier will be able to see the swirl where the round displaces the air and aim off according to the strength of the wind at different ranges. But you don't learn that by sitting in a classroom

PRACTISE, PRACTISE, PRACTISE

The average soldier might not do much training other than to pass their annual test because it's hard for units to commit to time on the ranges. So get involved in your regimental-brigade and divisional level shooting teams and competitions. With enough time to practise and decent coaching, there's a good shot within anybody.
